With the resulting mass firings, research funding cuts, censorship, and withdrawal from international collaborations, there is the potential for significant impact on Canadian researchers, health care professionals and patient outcomes. This is an information guide for researchers, healthcare professionals, and the general public to keep track of changes made by this administration that have potential impacts on healthcare in Canada.
